#### • The Vision:


- Create positive social and economic change through education of talented youth.

## **Design Considerations: Practical Solutions**

Challenges	Opportunities
Monitoring long term outcomes over time.	Set up evaluation design and data collection with a long horizon; focus on what can be learned in the short, medium, and long term.
Tracking Scholars and comparison group over time.	Develop tracking system that leverages partners, carefully consider attributes and motivations of each group and tailor data collection plans.
Managing attrition.	Plan for attrition in sampling plans.

## **Intervention Approach Considerations: Practical Solutions**

Challenges	Opportunities
Working across multiple partners with different priorities.	Use a collaborative approach to clarify overall vision, prioritize cross- cutting questions, and identify key indicators.
Working in geographically and culturally diverse contexts.	Bring partners together to discuss differences and find commonalities.
Defining what to measure and how to measure it.	Understand Program versus project definitions and consider multiple ways to measure key outcomes.





## **Summary**

#### • Design Considerations

• Developing a MEL framework early in the process allows for key issues to be indentified and built into the overall design.

#### Intervention Approach Considerations

• A highly collaborative approach between funders, implementers and evaluators yields buy-in for the evaluation.
